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1. Who we are

SolidarMed is a politically and denominationally neutral non-profit organisation active in development cooperation. Our head-office is based in Switzerland.

2. Our vision

As a competent and agile Non-Governmental-Organization (NGO) we develop local and innovative solutions for better health in Africa. We do this together with our partners. This means in particular:

3.1. Primary healthcare

We support our partners in expanding and sustainably improving preventive, curative, rehabilitative and palliative health care.

3.2. Innovation

We develop and pilot new solutions to strengthen healthcare systems. We hereby act as a catalyst, who promotes local development and transfers innovations.

3.3. Knowledge and dialogue

Knowledge is a decisive factor for the improvement of healthcare. We process our knowledge, communicate our findings, and promote their application through dialogue and advocacy. We support our partners in the acquisition, dissemination, and application of knowledge.
